Swami Vivekananda (12 January 1863 – 4 July 1902)

Swami Vivekananda (1863–1902) was a prominent Indian monk, philosopher, and spiritual leader, who is best known for his role in introducing Hindu philosophy and Vedanta to the Western world. Swami Vivekananda was born on January 12, 1863, as Narendranath Datta in Kolkata, India. He came from a well-educated and affluent family, and his early education was deeply rooted in both Western and Eastern philosophies. Vivekananda's philosophical approach focused on practical spirituality and self-improvement. Some of his core ideas included:

Self-Realization: He believed in the divinity within each person and that realizing this inner divinity leads to true freedom and peace.

Unity of Religions: He advocated the idea that all religions are valid paths to the same ultimate truth.

Empowerment of the Youth: Vivekananda strongly believed that the youth of India had the potential to bring about positive change, not just within India but globally.

Service to Humanity: He emphasized the importance of social service and the upliftment of the underprivileged.

Swami Vivekananda gained global fame after his famous speech at the World Parliament of Religions in Chicago in 1893. There, he introduced Hinduism, emphasizing religious tolerance and the oneness of all faiths. His opening words, "Sisters and brothers of America," earned him a standing ovation. His speech played a key role in introducing the spiritual wisdom of the East to the West.

In 1897, Vivekananda founded the Ramakrishna Mission, an organization that aimed to provide social service, educational opportunities, and spiritual guidance to people. The mission continues to work for the welfare of humanity, following the ideals laid down by Vivekananda. Swami Vivekananda passed away on July 4, 1902, at the age of 39, but his legacy lives on through his writings, speeches, and the work of the Ramakrishna Mission.
